## Musical Toys

The kids will love the noise in this exhibition of toys that make music (well, "musical sounds"), from a marching soldier beating a bass drum, through the toy piano favoured by Linus for his Beethoven recitals, the Duracell drumming bunny, to the increasingly irritating developments such as the Bee Gees Rhythm Machine, 1978. It culminates in sound performances that combine jazz, rock'n'roll and exper-

imental sounds made by Play Meccano Play by Pierre Bastien, consisting of Meccano, a pair of scissors, a comb, a paperweight, a teapot, an ashtray, two tooth brushes, an Indian banjo, a harmonium and a marimba. Antoine Schmitt and Jean-Jacques Birgé present their "Opera for 100 Electronic Bunnies", and Eric Schneider and Pascal Comelade have loaned their collections of musical toys, the former mainly of homemade items such as combs and washboards, the later of electronic gizmos. Better you than me. **D.L.**

## Thomas Schütte

Munich's Haus der Kunst has mounted this show by Düsseldorf-based Schütte on the back of a commission from the Oldenburg state savings bank for a large-scale sculpture outside its head office. The show is focused around a 1:1 Styrofoam and plaster model of the commission, *Man in Mud*, a monumental 5.8m-high bronze sculpture unveiled in the artist's home town of Oldenburg in June. Schütte has been working on the "Man in Mud" series since the early 1980s, and the model in Munich is surrounded by related sculptures from 1994. The rest of the show includes works from the 1980s to the present, curated by Patrizia Dander and Thomas Weski, deputy director of the



Haus der Kunst. Schütte's practice is extremely varied, and the full range from architectural models and watercolours to figurative sculpture and photography are on show—including a recent series of watercolours, "Deprinotes", 2006-08, as yet unseen by the public. ## Carl Gustav Carus: Nature and Idea

Carl Gustav Carus (1789-1869) was a medical doctor, natural scientist, philosopher and artist, and native son of Dresden. From his home town where he lived and worked all his life, he exercised an enormous influence over the development of German Romantic landscape painting through his theoretical writings (*Neuen Briefe über Landschaftsmalerei*, 1815-14) and his active promotion and patronage of artists such as his friend Caspar David Friedrich. Along with Goethe, he championed landscape as a means of

understanding the scientific basis of nature, as well as a catalyst of emotion and mood. His own landscapes are perhaps overly dependent on Friedrich's, but one can see how Carus was striving to achieve Schelling's Romantic idea of aesthetic appreciation as a species of spiritual awareness. This show is a collaboration between the Dresden Kupferstich-Kabinett and Galerie Neue Meister and the Alte Nationalgalerie, Berlin, and it presents 250 of Carus's works (more than half of which are from the Dresden State Art Collections), along with letters, documents, instruments, casts and skulls. The show travels to the Berlin museum (9 October-10 January 2010). **D.L.**

## Blood of Two: Matthew Barney and Elizabeth Peyton

Following the opening of the Venice Biennale and Art Basel, the Deste Foundation inaugurates its new space on the island of Hydra with a collaborative installation by Matthew Barney and Elizabeth Peyton. Details of the project remain a secret until

the opening, but Deste's exhibition coordinator says it will involve the "the people and the animals of Hydra". The island's Ecological Society is cooperating on the project and the only photo released shows scuba divers with what looks like one of Barney's vitrines (above). Add to that the location—an old slaughterhouse—and it promises to be an intriguing stop on this summer's Grand Tour. **Helen Stoilas**
